Roles & Responsibilities:

In this role, the successful candidate will work with our team to advise, lead and coordinate various operational projects for our breeding units to supply the local market first and, later on, export markets.

Animal focus to be on Rabbit, (dairy and meat) Sheep and Goats and Pig.

You will also support and advise the company's agronomy team across a portfolio of operations and projects focused on animal feeds and biosecurity, ensuring Kinyami Burundi delivers value.

Your work will focus on the following tasks: providing veterinary services to the company's breeding and animal production unit; conducts clinical assessments and disease investigations; implements feeding programs, (preventive) medicine practices and early disease diagnosis and treatment; monitors and enforces animal welfare standards; enforces biosecurity as well as various legislative acts, regulations and inspection services of national authorities for the treatment, prevention, control and eradication of diseases, investigating animal feed safety issues and diseases.

In this context, the candidate will also implement a decision-support platform by ensuring farm data collection and feedback to/from partners.

The Animal Production Specialist will have the following responsibilities:

• Data collection, encoding and analysis, documentation and report preparation



• Field work when necessary and hands-on assistance in various projects related to our breeding and animal production unit

• Preparation of presentations to deliver feedback, recommendations and challenge to our clients and partners

• Runs the daily management and operations of the animal production department

• Performs routine flock checks; conducts examination/clinical assessments on a regular basis; performs autopsies and collects laboratory sample; evaluates barn management and animal welfare; assess production data, records detailed clinical, environmental finding and animal husbandry data; summarizes findings; prepares reports and discusses with management

• Investigates disease outbreaks and drops in production, makes diagnosis, initiates a course of treatment or arranges for eradication and repopulation of a flock, if necessary

• Develops and modifies (Preventive) Medicine/Flock Health Programs; develops and follows Biosecurity protocols to prevent disease transmission

• Interprets laboratory reports, makes diagnosis and reports findings to management

• Issues prescriptions, instructs staff on proper dosage, mixing directions, method and rate of delivery

- · Installs new hardware and software and helps train staff on their usage
- Provides accurate and timely updates, status reports, and information on a timely basis
- Defines problems, collects supporting data, and draws conclusions

The company already has a partnership with RAMGEN from Serbia regarding ovine and caprine Artificial Insemination. It is not compulsory for the successful candidate to have the highest level of proficiency in Artificial Insemination as trainings in this specific field will be conducted, monitored and led by Dr Aleksandar Milovanović.

Other current partnerships are with:

- Hypharm (France) for rabbits
- Matić Romanovske (Serbia) for the Romanov sheep breed
- OSA Lacaune (France) for the Lacaune dairy sheep breed

The successful candidate will have to implement and build a 3-way program for meat sheep breeding (*Romanov and Charollais breeds*), a 2-way or 3-way program for meat goat (*Boer and Galla*) as well as for the dairy sheep breeding program (*Lacaune alone or with the Syrian Awassi breed*) and dairy goat breeding program (*Saanen and/or Alpine breeds*).

He/she will design, implement and lead the pig breeding program.
